








CHARACTER DAY CELEBRATION

Payment Plans are for ten (10) months and must be negotiated in May, prior to the new school year. The school facilitates Payment Plan contracts. The plan runs from June of the current year to March of the following year.

GRADE 6

2nd Term School Fees

A graduation fee of sixty dollars is added to the 2nd-term school fee for all 6th graders. This fee contributes toward some expenses associated with the Awards Ceremony, such as the venue, trophies, certificates, medals, and decorations.

Apart from the Awards Day, the Grade 6 teachers will organize several additional activities for the Grade 6 Activity Package at an extra cost. These activities may include a Grade 6 dinner, a class t-shirt, professional photos, and other student activities.

These additional activities aim to create lasting memories and a sense of achievement for our graduating students as they transition to the next phase of their educational journey. The cost of the Grade 6 Activity Package will be sent home by the end of the first term.

Participation in these activities is optional.

CUPCAKES ONLY!

Students will be allowed to bring cupcakes to school. All classroom teachers and the office have birthday forms, which parents should complete and return to the classroom teacher ahead of time. NO PARTY BAGS! NO MASCOTS! NO BALLOONS!

Sick Certificate

If a student is absent for a day or more, he/she should bring a note from his/her parent or a doctor's certificate stating why he/she was out of school. Students will not be allowed in classes without a note/certificate.

Tuition Refund Policy

If a student leaves within 1-2 weeks from the start of the term, the parent is entitled to 75% refund.

If a student leaves within 3-4 weeks from the start of the term, the parent is entitled to 50 % refund.

If a student leaves after
4 weeks from the start of the term,
the parent is not entitled to a
refund.

Registration, Capital Development Fund Fee, testing and special fees are non-refundable and non-transferable.



Cell Phones, Smart Watches or any Electronic Device are NOT ALLOWED in school!

If students are caught with them, they will be confiscated and returned to their parents at the end of the school year.



DROP & PICK UP
